FAIRNESS FOR STUDENT WORKERS

More than 3,000 students work for the Ontario government each summer.

They work in provincial parks, travel information centres, tourist attractions, on ferries and for many other programs.

Without the students, many government services that Ontarians enjoy in the summer could not run.

About half of the students earn minimum wage, \$9.50 an hour. Many are expected to work statutory holidays.

In the past, students received pay in lieu of vacation and statutory holidays. This year, the government will not pay out. Students will lose between \$400 and \$600.

How was the government able to do this? It exempted itself from its own law, the Employment Standards Act. The vacation and holiday pay requirements, which all other employers must follow, do not apply to the government or its agencies.

As a result, students making minimum wage for the government will actually earn less than they would at Wal-Mart or McDonalds.
