More than 600 OPSEU members are still on strike in these two communities.

“The purpose of any trade union is to share the burden of struggle among all its members so all members can make progress,” says Thomas.

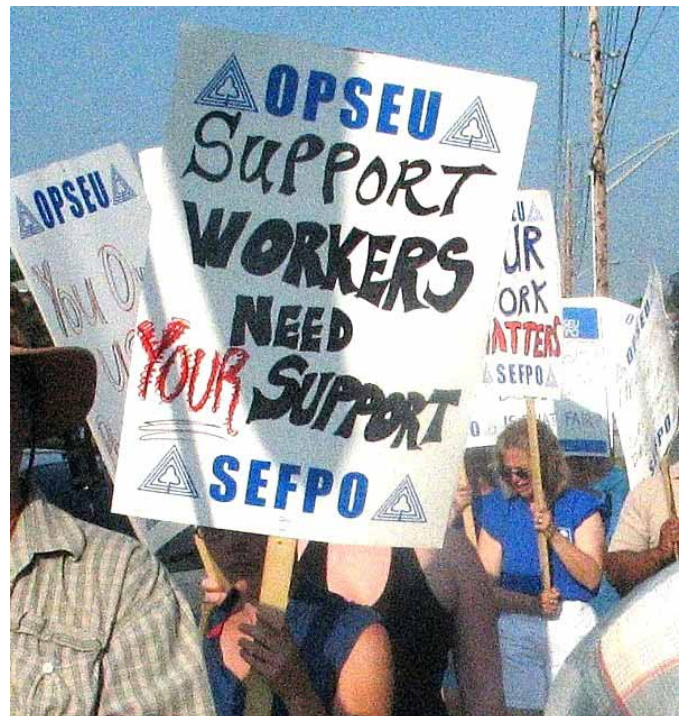
“Your contribution to the battle being waged by developmental services workers will play a big role in their inevitable success. Thank you in advance for your generosity and solidarity.”
