OPSEU's Canadian Blood Services Support Unit voted 95% to go on strike and got a deal a week before their July 25th strike date.

OPSEU's new Liquor Board Employees Division voted 84% to go on strike and got a deal less than 24 hours before their July 28th strike deadline.

It's now the turn of CAAT Support.

The colleges received \$100 million in new funding for 2005-06. They have offered you a package worth \$6 million this year, claiming they can't even give you a raise big enough to keep up with the rate of inflation.

Who's kidding who?

Managers took an average wage increase of more than seven per cent last year. In fact, that seven per cent raise cost more than \$13 million, or in excess of double what they our proposing for you in the first year of the new contract.!

With \$100 million in new funding from the province, the colleges do

not want to start the year with a strike. And neither do we.

Give us the tool we need to get the best deal possible. The colleges are testing your support.

On Thursday give your team a resounding strike vote they can take back to the table.

Canadian Blood Services Support Unit did it.

The Liquor Board Employees did it. It's now up to you.

August 4 – Vote NO to the offer, vote YES to authorize the strike.
