

What happens next

After the vote, the Labour Board will decide whether there will be one bargaining unit, as CUPE wishes, or whether Security will keep its own bargaining unit and its own collective agreement as OPSEU members wish.

We have teams in place, prepared to bargain a new collective agreement immediately, for both the Security and the Office, Professional and Clerical Units.

Until a new agreement is negotiated, you'll get the collective agreement you vote for- be it OPSEU 592's or CUPE 79's - so make sure it responds to your needs.

The Security Unit and OPSEU. Who we are.

We are radio operators, parking enforcement officers, fire safety officers, and about 175 uniformed Community Patrol officers who walk, ride, and drive the TCHC beat 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Our union OPSEU Local 592 is a multiple-unit local representing only housing staff at TCHC. In the Security Unit we have our own Collective Agreement, our own labour-management consultation structure, our own health and safety organization, and our own democratically elected stewards, unit stewards, and chair. Our union executive is elected from the two bargaining units of the local, both from TCHC.

In contrast, CUPE Local 79 is made up of one bargaining unit with 20,000 members city-wide.

What is OPSEU?

The Ontario Public Service Employees Union has about 100,000 members across Ontario. We represent workers from thousands of professions, including peace officers, paramedics, dispatchers, and other uniformed personnel. We negotiate hundreds of collective agreements every year.

OPSEU has a wealth of experience in issues affecting housing staff. We have fought hard against downloading, privatization and contracting out, and will continue to do so.

OPSEU has a special grievance policy: No member will be denied an opportunity to take a grievance forward because the Union can't afford it. Only OPSEU has this policy.

With OPSEU, you get service. OPSEU's staff includes professional negotiators, pension experts, and specialists in health and safety, worker's compensation, job security, research and communications.
